Mayor' Message

- In Pitcairn, as with many communities in Western Pennsylvania, mudslides havebecome safety concerns for our streets. The borough's greatest concerns at this time are the hazardous conditions on Hillside Avenue and Center Avenue (the New Road). Two stop signs have been placed on Center Avenue. Please observe them with all due caution. It is extremely important for SAFETY reasons that all drivers obey the signs and come to a complete stop.
- Nicer weather will soon be here and residences are reminded of Ordinance #978 Chapter 10 Subsection 602 regarding grass. It states that grass is to be no more than 6 inches high and shall not give off any unpleasant toxins or odors. Landlords should inform their tenants of the ordinance if this is their responsibility, but ultimately, the landlord is responsible. Failure to comply with the ordinance may result in a citation from the Police Department.
- ATTENTION DOG OWNERS & WALKERS! Pitcairn Borough Ordinance #397: Dog waste must be picked up immediately. Failure to do so will result in a fine of \$300-\$1,000



Clean-Up All residents are encouraged to participate in the annual Janie Summers Memorial Clean-up Day on April 21 from 8 to 11 a.m. Dumpsters will be placed at the Borough Building on Sixth Street, Fire Company #1 , 100 S. Center Avenue and Sugar Camp on Wall Avenue. Proof of Pitcairn residency is required at each site. No TV's, computers or electronics will be accepted due to Act 108. Freon appliances, batteries, scrap metal, other appliances and tires will only be accepted at Fire Co. #1 for a fee. Fees are as follows: refrigerators—\$20; air conditioners—\$15; motorcycle, car and light truck tires—\$5/with rims—\$10; and large truck tires—\$10/with rims—\$15.
