

From the Mayor The Borough has adopted and is enforcing the "Borough of Pitcairn Quality of Life Ordinance #1022" The article Quality of Life Ordinance #1023" The ordinance states in part that obstacles, such as debris and furniture should not block entrances into homes. This ordinance was adopted to protect

and enforce the maintenance of property and structures within the borough. Violation of the ordinance will result in a \$25 per day fine which will accrue until the problem is corrected. In addition to increasing the safety and appearances of properties, this will aid firefighters who will have immediate access to the interior of a home because obstacles will have been cleared from porches and yards.

Borough code requires that house numbers be posted. They should be reflective and at least 4 • inches high. This is required by the borough and the United States Postal Service.

There is a drug take back box located at the Police Station. Unused or no longer needed drugs must • be disposed of properly. They should not dispose of in the garbage, sinks or toilets. The box is located in the police station. You must ring the bell to access the building.

Notes from Code Enforcement

Clean-Up The Janie Summers Memorial Clean-up Day will be held April 25 from 8 to 11 a.m. Dumpster sites will be at Fire Co.#1,100 South Center Avenue and the old borough building, 582 6th Street. Litter will be collected at both sites. Collection supplies will also be available at the sites. Freon appliances, scrap metal, batteries and tires will only be taken at the Fire Department. Cost for recycling tires is as follows: Motorcycle, car and light truck \$5, with rim \$10. Large truck \$10, with rim \$15. NO TV'S, COMPUTERS OR ELECTRONICS OF ANY KIND CAN BE ACCEPTED DUE TO ACT 108. Photo ID and Proof of Residency is required. As mentioned above, the Code Enforcement office highly recommends using Clean-up Day to clean your porches off so that in the case of an emergency, it gives emergency responders more access to the building. As mentioned in the Mayor's section, there are penalties that will be enforced for not complying with ordinance #1023.


